

Item: Proposed Regulatory Language Update: Amend Disciplinary Guidelines, Substantial Relationship Criteria (for Licensees), Rehabilitation Criteria (for Licensees), Driving Record, and Handling of Military Applications; Add Substantial Relationship Criteria for Applicants and Rehabilitation Criteria for Applicants (AB 2138); Repeal Sponsored Events Provisions

Background: In accordance with the Board's Strategic Plan 2017-2021 and the passage of AB 2138 (statutes of 2018), the Proposed Regulatory Language was presented to the Board for approval at its March 1, 2019 meeting to pursue promulgating regulatory amendments. Following approval of the language on March 1, 2019, the Department of Consumer Affairs Legal Office suggested additional revisions related to the implementation of the AB 2138 provisions which were re-presented to the Board, and subsequently approved at its June 7, 2019 teleconference meeting.

Update since June 7, 2019 Meeting:

- 6/25: Submitted new rulemaking package to DCA Regulations Coordinator.
 - 7/15: Received and responded to an inquiry regarding economic/fiscal impact from the Budget Office.
 - 8/29: Received a request for additional minor edits from DCA Regulations Coordinator.
 - 9/3: Returned revised documents to DCA Regulations Coordinator.
 - 9/6: Received a call from the Legal Office indicating the Budget Office had requested consideration to address the various components in the current package into separate regulatory packages. Due to the significant staff resources already expended on this project (from February - present), the request was declined.
 - 9/27: Received an email from the Budget Office asking if we had been contacted by the Legal Office with the request to break up the regulatory package. Indicated we spoke with Legal on 9/6 and decided to maintain the package as is.
 - 10/9: Monthly update from DCA Regulations Coordinator indicates the regulatory package remains with the Budget Office for review.
- Note:** Once the package is approved by the Budget Office, it will need to be reviewed/approved by the Director's Office then sent to Agency for review/ approval before the official rulemaking process can begin.
