ANTONIO, EDY IBARRA JR. – RCP 40646

Committed a fraudulent, dishonest, or corrupt act that is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a respiratory care practitioner in that he admitted to answering an escort advertisement and arranging a meeting with two minors. Pursuant to a Proposed Decision by an Administrative Law Judge, license revoked effective January 6, 2026.

CONTI, JACOB STEVEN – RCP 42318

Illegally possessed, used, or administered to himself, any controlled substances, or possessed any associated paraphernalia in that he was arrested for using or being under the influence of a controlled substance, to wit: methamphetamine, possession of a controlled substance, to wit: methamphetamine, and possession of a smoking device. Pursuant to a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, license revoked, stayed, and placed on four (4) years' probation effective February 13, 2026.

KLEYTMAN, MIRA – RCP 17269

Committed a fraudulent, dishonest, or corrupt act that is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a respiratory care practitioner; obtained or possessed any controlled substance; engaged in unprofessional conduct; and violated or attempted to violate, directly or indirectly, any provision or provisions of the RCPA in that she fraudulently removed and concealed controlled substances not prescribed to her from a MedStation. Pursuant to a Default Decision and Order, license revoked effective March 5, 2026.

EXPLANATION OF DISCIPLINARY LANGUAGE AND ACTIONS

Effective date of decision: The date the disciplinary decision goes into operation.

Default Decision: A decision based on the licensee's failure to respond to formal charges after it has been served, or failure to appear at an Administrative Hearing. All charges are deemed true. The decision results in the revocation of the license.

Disciplinary Order: An order for discipline adopted by the Board.

Probation: Allows the licensee to practice as a respiratory care practitioner under terms and conditions for a set amount of time.

Proposed Decision: A decision rendered by an Administrative Law Judge through an Administrative Hearing. A proposed decision must be adopted by the Board before it can go into effect.

Revoked: The right to practice is ended due to disciplinary action. The license is invalidated, voided, annulled, or rescinded. The individual can no longer practice as a respiratory care practitioner in California.

Revoked, Stayed: "Stayed" means the revocation is postponed. Professional practice may continue so long as the licensee complies with specified terms and conditions of probation.

Stipulated Settlement: A form of plea bargaining. The case is formally negotiated and settled prior to a hearing.

Stipulated Surrendered: The Board agrees to allow the licensee to surrender the license as a resolution to a disciplinary matter. The individual can no longer practice as a respiratory care practitioner in California.
